
We are incredibly proud of our NAPLAN results but they are only one small part of the assessment used by staff to support our students.

ANNUAL REPORT


The school annual report for 2024 was presented at School Council last night. Once approved it will be available on our website.

Highlights of how our families and students feel about the school were available in the data below.


Student Attitudes to School – Sense of Connectedness

TREE REMOVAL

We have needed to remove some trees to build the gymnasium. All trees were assessed by arborists and the approvals given. I even had Murrundindi check there were no possums in the old possum nest on the oval. He gave us the all clear.

I had lengthy conversations about the large tree at the junior playground. It is where the disability ramp goes, a legal requirement that is lengthy due to its low gradient. We got the engineer to look at a timber ramp and other alternatives. Unfortunately we could not work around it and the foundations would have affected the roots.

A couple of years ago the tree had a termite infestation, which was treated and I have kept a close eye on it. It is assessed every year. When it was cut down we found wood rot through the entire base and it was actually really unsafe.

Change is difficult for everyone, but in this instance the safety of the students has been ensured by its removal. We are incredibly fortunate to have the huge amounts of trees we do on our site providing greenery and shade, but it is a huge job to ensure all trees on site are also safe.

All school building works require 2 trees to be planted for every one removed. There is a planting plan as part of the build. The school also has plans to landscape our Kent Ave entrance once the gym is in place. The area around the hall needs updating and hopefully some new natural playground can also be included. This work is a 2026 project but planning will need to begin mid year. We will ensure shade trees are part of this plan.


