All forms are due back next week on May 9. Please remember to return your form as soon as possible.


PREP ENROLMENTS

BIRD HOTEL SUCCESS!

Last term 5/6T were involved in the creating of a dense bird hotel habitat to provide extra cover for the Thornbill species in the sanctuary.

This week it was great to see the birds using the habitat, meaning the experiment was successful! In the coming weeks students in years 3 to 6 will help create more of these small habitat structures in the sanctuary during Environmental Education lessons.

These habitats are an important first step in our regeneration work in the sanctuary, giving the birds spaces to move to when we are working in their usual areas.





HEALESVILLE SANCTUARY INTERESTING FACTS

Healesville Sanctuary, formally known as the Sir Colin MacKenzie Sanctuary, is a zoo specialising in native Australian animals.

Healesville is on land that was formerly part of the Aboriginal reserve known as Coranderrk. Coranderrk was an <u>Aboriginal</u> reserve run by the Victorian government between 1863 and 1924. Murrundindi's mother lived on Coranderrk and he is able to show us shelter trees on our tour.

The first platypus bred in captivity was born in the Sanctuary in 1943.

In 2009, the sanctuary was threatened by the Black Saturday bushfires, and the sanctuary evacuated their threatened species to Melbourne Zoo
