






INTERSCHOOL SPORT FINALS

Hello families,

Only one week left of the term before the school holiday program begins. We hope everyone has had a wonderful term and we look forward to seeing what we all get up to next term. If you have not yet done so, please book in for our school Holiday activities so that we can ensure we have enough supplies and staff for the day.

<u>Important Information:</u> if your child is home sick or not coming to Before or After School Care you need to cancel their booking with us not just inform the school. Next week for the last week of term I (Alex), will be away for the entire week. Josh will be here for most of the week with Chloe here Wednesday morning. I will also be away for the first four weeks of term 3 due to completing my final placement for my bachelor's degree. During my placement, Josh, Chloe and lang will provide care for the children.

In week 9 we spent the week being very creative. The children explored Toys Week. We created our own toys, explored some of the children's favourite activities in the room such as playing a version of hide and seek called "Night at the museum" or as we called it this week "Andy's home". The children also explored some things they do at home, such as playing a game called Sprunki where they played musical challenges. We extended this theme by making some sprunki masks and the children used Lego to create their own Sprunkis. The Lego Sprunkis had their own characteristics and names.

During week 10 we have been exploring rainbow week. This was a suggestion from one of the children. We started our week by making some fluffy foam slime for each colour of the rainbow. This was messy fun, and the children are looking forward to playing with it again during the week. In addition to the slime, we have been continuing our science themed activities by setting out a rainbow milk experiment and a walking water rainbow that the children can observe throughout the week. We incorporated a few active games this week to provide opportunities for active play, enabling the children to get outside and play colour corners and crab soccer. This was a great way to encourage the children to be active throughout the sessions.

The children have been excited watching our Charity Chart grow this term as they earned stickers over the term. We are excited to share that we have reached our goal of \$50 dollars, to be donated to Maneki Neko Cat Rescue.















