FAREWELL AND ALL THE BEST SARAH BIRD


Sarah Bird leaves us on Friday September 5 to await the arrival of her baby. We wish her all the best at this exciting time.

A huge thank you to Megan Forster for preparing all the activities.






BOOK WEEK

The school buys all of the short listed books every year and each teacher chooses a book to develop a lesson around. The huge variety of lessons was wonderful.





The story of moving the zoo

More than a hundred years ago, Sydney's residents were woken by a cacophony of weird and wonderful noises. The zoo animals were on the move.

Over the course of six months in 1916, hundreds of Sydney's favourite animals left behind their dismal and outdated cages at the old Moore Park Zoo and were shepherded through the city streets before being ferried across the harbour to their new, purpose-built home – Taronga Zoological Park. From a 4-ton elephant named Jessie, to kangaroos, lions and cockatoos, animals big and small made this extraordinary journey to a new life in one of the world's most beautiful zoos.







In 1916, Jessie the elephant moved from Moore Park Zoo – her home of over 30 years – to more spacious grounds in the new Taronga Zoological Park, on the northern side of Sydney Harbour. For this journey, Jessie walked through the city streets in the early hours of Sunday, 24 September, guided by the zoo's head keeper, Mr Miller, then through the Domain and down Macquarie Street to a waiting vehicle ferry at Bennelong Point.

Her feet became sore on the hard roads, and at times she grew nervous in unfamiliar surrounds, but with 'a pat on the shoulder, or a reassuring grip on her ear ... she [passed] through narrow streets or across tram rails' to reach the waiting ferry. The pontoon dipped alarmingly under her 4-ton weight as she alighted at Taronga, but with words of encouragement from her keepers 'she finally tip-toed across the pontoon and on to the wharf'. By 7am she had been introduced to her new home, built to resemble an exotic Indian temple.

Jessie lived out the rest of her long life at Taronga.

Here are some Dung Beetle facts:

Dung beetles are strong, excellent navigators that eat and bury animal waste, helping the environment by recycling nutrients and controlling pests.

They use the sun, moon, and even the Milky Way to navigate.

Some species roll balls of dung, while others burrow into dung piles to lay eggs.

Lifespan: Depending on the species, adult dung beetles can live for several months to a few years. Their lifespan is influenced by factors such as food availability, environmental conditions, and predation.

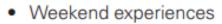
