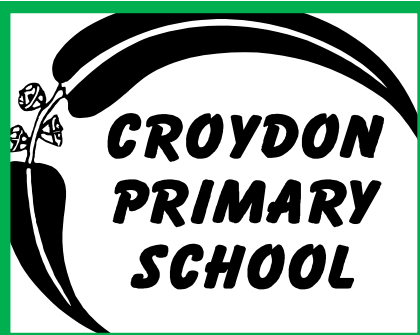

BOOK WEEK

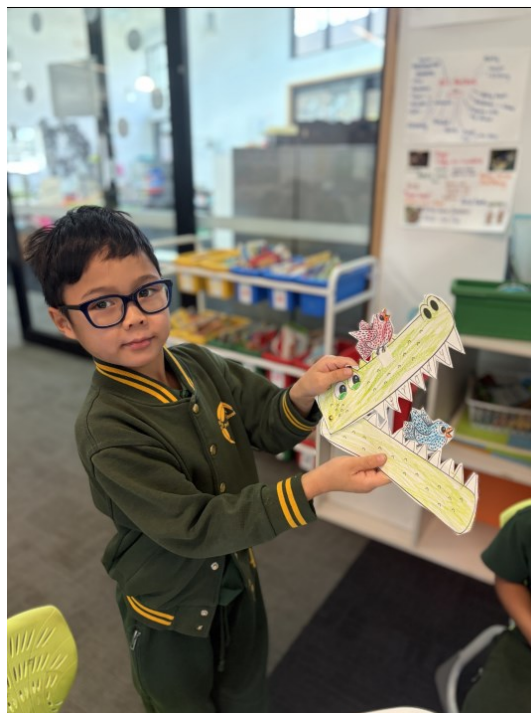
Thank you to the staff for the really engaging activities all the students experienced last Thursday.

I was surprised at the School Review that one of the Principals had not seen the books and was unaware this is what Book week is about.

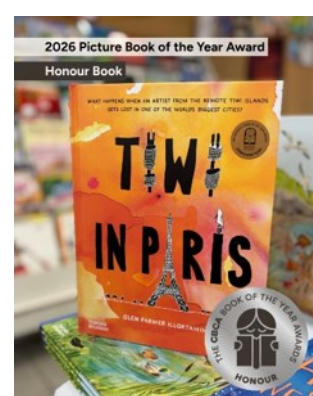
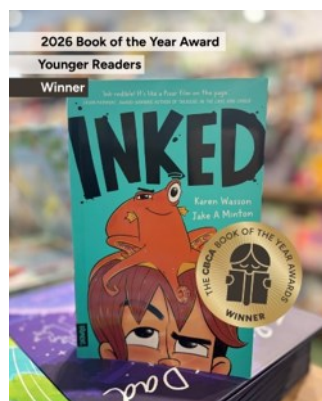
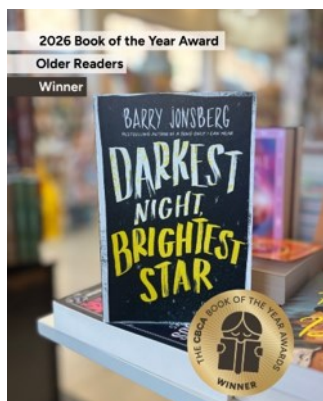
